Graduate Certificate in Translation and Translation Studies (14 Cr)

The Graduate Certificate in Translation and Translation Studies, an interdisciplinary effort of several A&S departments (English, Romance and Arabic Languages and Literatures (RALL), Judaic Studies and Asian, East European and German Studies (AEGS)), aims to provide graduate (Masters and PhD) students with broad training in the theory, techniques, and philosophy of translation and translation studies. Students can earn this Certificate for pre-professional purposes or to become more knowledgeable about translation as a creative art and technique.
